Bro. Ed's Epistle "In the seventh month on the first of the month you shall have a rest, a reminder by blowing of trumpets, a holy convocation." Leviticus 23;24

The Jewish festival of trumpets is more commonly called Rosh Hashana or "head of the year". It marks the beginning of the New Year, and concludes with the Day of Atonement or Yom Kippur ten days later. We are in that time period now. While we do not observe these festivals as Christians, they have tremendous meaning for us. The High Priest entered the Holy of Holies on the Day of Atonement and sprinkled the blood of animals on the mercy seat. In so doing, He represented all Israel in repentance from their sins, and in seeking God's mercy and forgiveness. For us, we no longer require the death of an animal to atone for our sins. Instead, Jesus has shed His blood once and for all to grant forgiveness and eternal life to all who believe in Him.
